Schlossplatz 1



"A mighty fortress is our God" - This line of text taken from the famous hymn, inscribed in large letters encircles the bell tower of this impressive church. The author of the song, the reformer Martin Luther, was to make this church, which was built on the foundation of a former castle, known around the world. On 31st October 1517 he nailed his 95 theses on to the main door.



Cranach Houses
and Courtyards

Markt 4 and Schlossstraße 1

The residence at "Markt 4" dates back to the Renaissance period. The famous painter Lucas Cranach the Elder and the book publisher Christian Döring ran a printing shop together, where among others the Bible, translated by Martin Luther and known as the "September Testament", was reproduced. Between 1517/1518 Cranach acquired the largest courtyard in Wittenberg in the Schlossstraße 1, to expand his workshop. After he was given the privilege to run pharmacies, he traded here with paper, paints, sugar, wax, sand stone, and spices. Today both houses are listed buildings and attract visitors with arts, crafts, and culture.

Lutherstraße 42

The LUTHER 1517 Panorama – a highlight of the Luther Year 2017 in Wittenberg – is dedicated to the events that took place in Wittenberg 500 years ago, when the monk and scholar Martin Luther published his 95 Theses on the reform of the (Catholic) Church and thus set in motion a dramatic movement that had a deep impact on the history and religion of the world.

Parish Church St. Mary's

Kirchplatz 20



The St. Mary's Town and Parish Church is the oldest building in town and is now listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Martin Luther used to preach in this church. His companion Johannes Bugenhagen clarified Reformation insights here. The famous painter Lucas Cranach the Elder designed the Reformation altar, which you can admire during a guided tour. You can also discover valuable paintings by Cranach, the elaborately decorated baptismal font by Hermann Vischer the oldest piece of the church, the magnificent organ as well as the vestry of contemporary art.

Melanchthon House

Collegienstraße 60



This Renaissance style house in Wittenberg, built in 1536, is an architectural gem. The humanist and reformer Philipp Melanchthon lived and worked in this house until his death. The memorial was restored and expanded with addition of a modern new building that presents the exhibition Life-Work-Legacy. Some of the objects have never been on display before, among them an original salary receipt issued to Melanchthon as a university professor, and the first handwritten history of the city of Wittenberg penned by Melanchthon.

The Luther House was originally in 1504, an Augustinian monastery. Later it became the home of the reformer Martin Luther.

Today the Luther House is the largest Reformation museum in the world and is on the list of UNESCO World Heritage sites.

The permanent exhibition at the Luther House offers you an encounter with the time of the Reformation. Due to renovation work, the Luther House will be closed until mid 2025.

Therefore a special exhibition "Literally Luther. Facets of a Reformer" is open in the nearby Augusteum.

In the castle

The Christian Art Foundation Wittenberg was founded by the couple Dr Gisela Meister Scheufelen and Dr Ulrich Scheufelen from Baden Württemberg in July 2001. In the exhibition "Christian Messages from Chagall to Beuys" you will find an extraordinary collection of drawings dealing with Christian topics by internationally renowned artists of the 20th century. Alongside portfolio works by Marc Chagall, Otto Dix, James Ensor, George Rouault, Max Slevogt and the HAP Grieshaber, expressive single works by e.g. Max Beckmann, Karl Schmidt-Rottluff, Max Pechstein, Erich Heckel, Ernst Barlach, Käthe Kollwitz, Pablo Picasso, Joseph Beuys and Keith Haring are on display.



House of History

Schlossstraße 6

Dive into Wittenberg in the distant past, you can reminisce or marvel at how comfortable your parents or grandparents had lived as they celebrated and played as children. The exhibition presents the everyday family life of the 1920s through to the „turning point“ 1990 levels. Of particular appeal in the House of History in Wittenberg are the permanent exhibitions "GDR life design & forms of the 70s", "Signs - time mark, German Russians in everyday life in a central German region from 1945 to 1993" and "Luther in the GDR".

The exhibition provides an insight into the general city development regarding history, present and future of the Arsenalplatz, and its buildings. This includes the use of the Artillery Carriage House on the Arsenalplatz as a new exhibition building for the Municipal Collections of Lutherstadt Wittenberg. The collections, from which a selected part is presented here, consist of several parts, such as the archive and city-historical collection and the natural history and ethnographic collections of Julius Riemer.



Alaris Butterfly Park

The Alaris Butterfly Park in Lutherstadt Wittenberg, with its 1.000 m², is the largest butterfly park in Germany. In the tropical landscape you can see many butterflies and over 140 species in all sizes and colours in a very natural environment. In the cafeteria you can enjoy snacks.



Under palm trees, banana trees, coffee shrubs, bromeliads, orchids and many other exotic plants, colourful butterflies flutter around hundreds of visitors from all over the world. Whether alone, with loved ones, with family or with friends, a butterfly safari in the paradise of Lutherstadt Wittenberg has something for everybody.



Historic Town
Information Center

Mauerstraße 18

The Reformation was not the first spectacle to the city of Wittenberg. Rudolf II of the Ascanians was the elector of Wittenberg beginning in 1356. In the former Franciscan monastery church is the present history of the House of Ascania and thus the origin of today's Saxony-Anhalt.



Hundertwasser School

Schillerstraße 22a

The school in need of renovation was rebuilt and designed by the famous artist Hundertwasser and completed in early 1999. The interior of the school was designed by the high school young artists in the style of Hundertwasser. Today the Hundertwasser School captivates with its many colorful surfaces and a planted roof. There is an information area for tourists, where you can get notices, books, and leaflets about the school. You can also purchase Hundertwasser souvenirs and be guided through the school by the pupils themselves.



Piesteritz Worker's Estate

Karl-Liebknecht-Platz 20

The factories municipal, Piesteritz was designed by the town planner George Haberland and architect Rudolf Otto Salvisberg, and constructed in 1916, with the aim to achieve a beautiful uniform working-class neighbourhood with consistent construction quality. Piesteritz is the first car-free settlement in Germany and was redeveloped for the occasion of Expo 2000.
